

**RESOLUTION R01-42**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
PALOS VERDES ESTATES, CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING  
A POLICY FOR CITIZEN RECOGNITION**

WHEREAS, the unique quality of life enjoyed by residents of and visitors to Palos Verdes Estates is reflected in the natural, unadorned beauty of the community; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council to preserve this natural environment to the greatest extent possible; and


WHEREAS, to maintain this environment, it is the general philosophy of the City Council to neither encourage nor support the naming of land, buildings, plantings, or facilities in honor of a resident or individual; and

NOW, THEREFORE, it shall be the exclusive purview of the Mayor and/or the City Council to initiate any recognition of residents or individuals who have served the nation, the State of California and/or the City in an exceptional and distinguished manner, by naming land, a building or a facility in honor of said resident or individual.


SECTION 1. Such recognition shall be afforded only after an appropriate waiting period, generally not less than six months, has passed to honor residents or individuals who have served the nation, the State of California and/or the City of Palos Verdes Estates.

SECTION 2. Such recognition shall be afforded only to those residents and individuals who have served in an exceptional and distinguished manner, and where such action is warranted by a contribution of service which is deemed to be of major significance.
