



Revised Athens Refuse Contract Begins July 1 – Pay Less/Get More



he City Council, after a public process, has awarded a new 7-year refuse services contract for single family homes to our current hauler, Athens Services.

There are many positive changes to the contract and we are very excited about the services. Effective July 1st:

- The monthly rate drops from \$35.50 to \$34.48.
- Residents do not need to separate recyclables; refuse and recyclables may be comingled and disposed of together. Athens will transport the comingled waste to their Material Recovery Facility, and remove the recyclable materials for reuse. This will increase the amount of materials that can be recycled and reused, and decrease what goes to a landfill. Residents can continue to use the existing "blue" containers for comingled waste; however, as they deteriorate,

Athens will remove blue containers and they will not be replaced.

- Since recyclables are now combined with regular waste, everything will be collected weekly. There is no longer the need for biweekly recyclable collection.
- Food waste, such as vegetables, meat, coffee grounds, etc., can be placed within the Green Waste container and will be composted. Green waste will be collected weekly.
- Athens will continue to provide its Bulky Trash pick-up.
- Athens will provide an annual "shred day" where residents can bring documents to be shredded and recycled.
- Athens will provide a fleet of new trucks powered by natural gas.



The "29th Annual National Night Out" (NNO), is a unique crime/drug prevention event sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch (NATW). What is National Night Out? It's America's Night Out Against Crime!

Last year's National Night Out campaign involved citizens, law enforcement agencies, civic groups, businesses, neighborhood organizations and local officials from over 15,000 communities from all 50 states, U.S. territories, Canadian cities and military bases worldwide. In all, over **37 million** people participated in National Night Out 2011.

NATIONAL NIGHT OUT is designed to:

- Heighten crime and drug prevention awareness;
- Generate support for, and participation in, local anticrime programs;

- Strengthen neighborhood spirit and policecommunity partnerships; and



City Hall will be open on Thursday evening, July 12th from 6:00 p.m. until 7:30 p.m., in addition to its regular hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., for those who would like to renew their dog's license. Cash, check (payable to the "City of PVE"), VISA or Mastercard accepted (please note cash only for vaccinations). If the renewal form does not have current rabies vaccination or current sterilization information, please bring a copy of your dog's current rabies certificate (it must be valid through June 30, 2013), and/or the certificate of sterilization.


Resurfacing Projects in the Upcoming Year


ity staff is preparing to bid the FY 12/13 Resurfacing Projects, which will take place this year in the Upper Malaga Cove area of the City. Construction is expected to begin in late July and continue through September. No work will be scheduled during the first week of school.

Two types of resurfacing will take place: overlay and slurry seal resurfacing. Overlay resurfacing involves grinding the asphalt 1.5 inches down in 5-foot-wide sections at the edges of the street, and then placing pavement fabric and 1.5 inches of new hot asphalt over the entire street. It is generally possible to drive on overlaid streets within three hours of the overlay occurring.

Slurry seal resurfacing takes place using a Type II latex slurry seal treatment. Slurry seal is a liquid asphalt emulsion designed as a sealant to extend the useful life of a street. It will last approximately 5 to 7 years. Slurry seal takes a long time to dry, and it is generally possible to drive on slurry sealed streets after five hours of the slurry seal being spread.

Please see the maps for streets that have been called out for overlay and slurry seal resurfacing. As City staff completes their survey of the streets and their current condition, some overlay project streets may become slurry seal project streets and vice-versa.




