Peafowl-History



- ▶ Introduced to the PV Peninsula by community founder Frank Vanderlip in 1924
 - Unmanaged population until the City enacted a Peafowl Management Plan in 1986 (settlement agreement)
 - Managed by Police Department
 - Established two distinct zones
 - Malaga Cove Zone (Malaga Cove Flock)
 - Espinosa Circle Zone (Luanda Bay Flock)
 - Semi-annual peafowl census
 - Must maintain 21 bird minimum in each zone
 - Trapping and relocating program



Peafowl-Management Efforts



- Education
 - Street and Parks Maintenance Foreman Anthony Mendoza is our resident trapper/expert
 - Assists residents when peafowl issues arise
 - Strategies to dissuade peafowl from remaining on your property
 - Coordinates trapping if warranted
- Trapping (on private property with owner consent)
 - Outside designated zones (Dependent on mating/chick season)
 - Generally when found outside the zone
 - ► Inside designated zones (Dependent on flock numbers and mating/chick season)
 - Generally when peafowl destroy property or become a nuisance
- Relocating
 - Temporary holding pen next to police station
 - Cared for by Streets and Parks crew
 - Adopted to pre-approved individuals off the Peninsula
