ARRESTS

08-22-2024 Warrant Arrest

200 BLK PALOS VERDES DR W

At approximately 2:27 AM, an officer observed a vehicle code violation and conducted a traffic stop and arrested the driver for two outstanding misdemeanor warrants.

08-24-2024 Impaired Driver

500 BLK VIA ALMAR

At approximately 1:58 AM, an officer responded to a report of a possible collision. Officers did confirm a collision occurred and arrested a driver for driving under the influence of alcohol.

08-24-2024 Impaired Driver

300 BLK PALOS VERDES DR W

At approximately 10:27 PM, an officer observed a vehicle with no headlights working and conducted a traffic stop. In contacting the driver, the officer noticed a smell of moderate odor of an unknown alcoholic beverage emitting from inside the vehicle and conducted standardized field sobriety tests and arrested the driver for driving under the influence of alcohol and later added a Blood Alcohol Content over 0.08%.

Once inside, the suspect(s) ransacked moving boxes. Suspect(s) removed memorabilia and antiques before exiting the residence through the front door.

Sometime between approximately 6:45 PM and 8:45 PM, unknown suspect(s) smashed rear sliding glass door located on the second floor and gained access to locked residence. Suspect(s) entered through broken glass and ransacked the master bedroom and removed items before exiting the residence through the same smashed sliding glass door.
