

Homeowners Guide to Used Oil and Household Hazardous Waste Management

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that just one quart of oil can pollute 250,000 gallons of water?



Improper vehicle maintenance practices are the largest single source of oil pollution in our streams and rivers. A car that is slowly leaking oil or a couple of drops spilled in the driveway when changing the oil may seem miniscule, however; its expansive nature makes it a major water quality problem! One pint of oil can make a slick larger than a football field, poisoning wildlife that comes in contact with it.

Every drop of oil spilled onto the ground adds up to a major pollution problem! Each of us can go the extra yard for our environment by doing the following:

- Maintain your vehicle so that it doesn't leak. A simple way to see if you have a leak is to park your vehicle over a piece of cardboard overnight.
- Keep your vehicle tuned to reduce oil use.
- Never do engine work in the streets as this is the direct path into the storm drain!
- To control spillage, use a funnel when pouring liquids and place drip pans beneath your vehicle to catch spills.



Household Hazardous Waste

Leftover household products that contain corrosive, toxic, ignitable or reactive ingredients are considered to be "household hazardous waste" or "HHWs". HHWs can be found in your bathroom, kitchen, laundry room, and garage. Improper disposal includes pouring HHWs down the drain, on the ground, or in some cases putting them out with the trash. Proper disposal of HHWs is actually easy by taking them to your nearest collection center! The Town's collection center will accept the following items:

HHWs:

Paint and solvents, used motor oil and filters, anti-freeze, automotive fluids, cleaning products, pool and garden chemicals, aerosol cans, all medicines, auto batteries, and household batteries.



Electronic Waste:

Computers, monitors, printers, network equipment, cables, telephones, televisions, microwaves, video games, cell phones, radios, stereos, VCRs, and electronic toys.

Remember that these items can be disposed of or recycled at locations that are offered within the Town and County.



Household Hazardous Waste Round-ups are held throughout the year.

REMEMBER!

By recycling/disposing of these items properly you can do your part to protect the environment.
